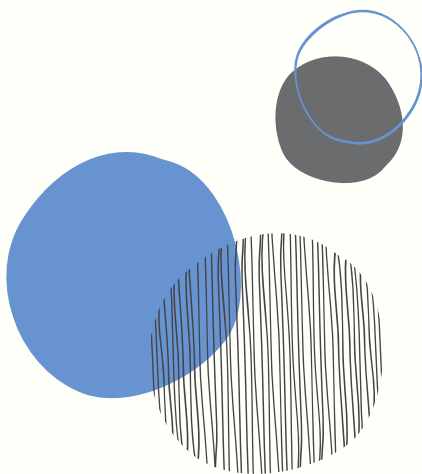
A gentle reminder that the club will be **CLOSED** on Christmas Day and there will not be any tractor service. We look forward to welcoming you back as we continue through the festive season.

SCUBA DIVING

The scuba divers launched last weekend in less than ideal conditions, but as always, the ocean delivered something special. A fascinating discussion unfolded around whip coral gobies after a *Bryaninops tigris* was photographed by DUC member **Adrian Pearton**. According to Adrian, this sighting may be a new record for South Africa, with previous sightings recorded in Mozambique. While most whip coral gobies adapt their colouring to match their host coral, Adrian noted that a particular white soft coral species is only ever white or pale yellow. A great reminder that even in challenging conditions, the ocean continues to surprise us with its smallest and most intricate life forms. The Dorado Bonanza was a huge success, serving as the perfect finale to the year for our members and providing holidaymakers with an opportunity to test their skills against those of our coastal residents. The event drew a phenomenal 319 anglers with plenty of ladies and juniors in the mix, which was great to see. In the end, though, it was **Scott Magnus**, fishing from his Yeld Cat "Whiplash," who secured the win and earned himself the R15,000 cash prize. There were some other great catches made on the day, including a 22.8kg Wahoo, caught by junior angler **JC Lubbe**.

Cooler water moved into the Durban area just ahead of the competition and made finding fish pretty tricky, and this is expected to stay the same through this weekend, but is forecast to move closer to the 25°C mark within the next 10 days. With all the rain around at the moment, it looks like we will all be working a little harder for our fish through this weekend, but we should see a marked improvement after the weekend and into the New Year.

Even though Dorado are the main target species in December, there are still plenty of Geelbek, Daga, reef species, and even some really good Yellowtail around, and these fish don't mind the cooler conditions while we wait for the gamefish to return. There have also been positive reports of good-sized snoek on the colour line on the North Coast, so there is still plenty to keep us busy on the water.

All that remains now is to wish all of our members and your families a very merry Christmas, from all at DSBC.
