OPEN WATER SWIMMING

A fantastic turnout for our **March League Swim**, with 260 swimmers taking part in what can only be described as perfect conditions. SCUBA DIVING

INSANE conditions at T-Barge this weekend. With over 30m visibility and a warm 27°C, divers were treated to some of the best conditions we have seen in a long time. T-Barge, one of ORI's artificial reefs, was sunk on 19 December 1990 and has since transformed into a thriving underwater habitat. This massive concrete structure, measuring 30m by 20m with 48 compartments, is now home to an abundance of marine life including baitfish, batfish, lionfish and pineapple fish. The steel gantry at the T-junction adds even more character to this already unique site. It is easy to see why this has become a firm favourite among local divers.
