SPEARFISHING

DUC recently hosted the 4th and final spearfishing trials for the KZN teams who will represent the province at nationals later this year. Conditions in the selected zones, from Southern Breakwater to Warner Beach, were beautiful overall, with some dirty patches near the rivers and channels. Most divers managed to land a snoek each, along with some quality reef fish. A standout catch was **Sean Burns'** impressive speckled snapper. The top two divers posted very strong bags with high-scoring totals, setting a serious benchmark for the rest of the field. SCUBA DIVING

The scuba divers enjoyed a double dive on Sunday, starting at No.1 and then heading to Blood Reef. Highlights from **Bryan Hart** included an interesting observation about the gobies that inhabit the long whip corals of No.1 and the Bluff. These fish have relatives that live in Black Coral Trees, also found on the 031 reef systems. On Sunday's dive, a concerted effort was made to visit a specific "white" black coral tree that hosts more than 20 of these fascinating little fish. 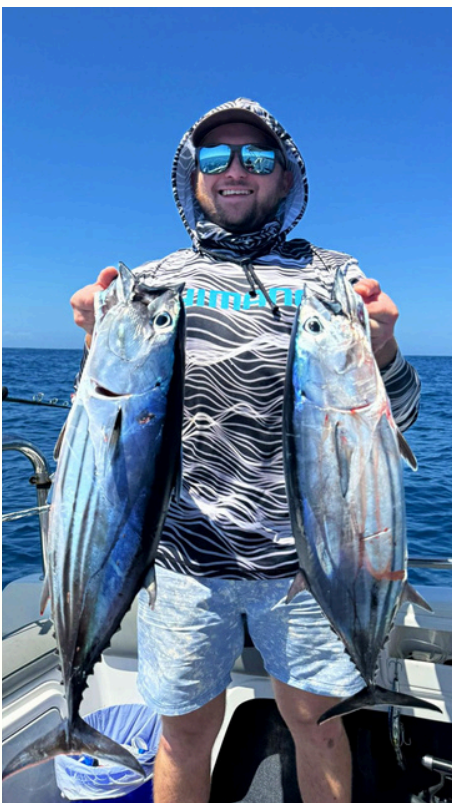
Durban Ski Boat Club



Not much fishing was done over the last week due to the weather conditions, but water temperatures in the deep remain around the 26 °C mark. This meant that good catches of Dorado were made on Friday and in the smaller weather gap on Saturday. Inshore, though, the water colour has been pretty poor after all the recent rain, which seems to have slowed the Couta fishing down a fair bit. Nevertheless, some really good fish have been coming out south of Durban, where the water has been somewhat cleaner, and some decent Yellowfin tuna have been around as well. We have the first signs of the change of season approaching later this week, when the first proper cut-off low comes blasting up from the Cape, reaching Durban late on Saturday. This leaves Friday and Saturday morning as the most likely fishing gaps for this week, and with only light, scattered showers forecast for this week, the water should have a chance to clean up a bit by then.

We are heading into a couple of exciting weekends this month, with the **Durban Interclub** coming up on the weekend of the **13th to the 15th of March**. On the fishing days, we appeal for your patience with the 25 competition boats, which will be on the beach very early in the morning and will be the first vessels pushed in by the tractors.

The following weekend, on the **21st March**, is our **CMH Pelagic Social Competition** with cash prizes of R20 000 up for grabs. With all the gamefish species currently in our Durban waters, this should be a really exciting event, and everyone has a chance of getting in on the prizes. Entry fee is R200 per person, and this includes a free boerie roll at the weigh-in. This competition is open to all ski boat anglers, so please spread the word.
