We have 25 teams from across the province participating in this event, making it the largest Interclub in recent memory. Durban Ski Boat Club has 4 very talented teams in the battle, including 2 junior teams. If you're at the club on either of the days, join us for the weigh-in and support our teams. We wish all our anglers all the very best and smooth seas for the tournament. Please remember that on Saturday and Sunday, the competition boats will be on the beach very early, and they will take first priority for tractor pushes.

Coming up on the following weekend, we will be holding our **CMH Pelagic Species Social Competition**, with cash prizes of R20 000 up for grabs. This event is open to all ski boat anglers and offers all anglers a shot at the prizes with a wide variety of species to target. Entry is R200, and this includes a boerie roll at weigh-in.

The weather over the past week kept most boats off the water, but the few that did venture out reported that the Coute bite has slowed right down, probably as a result of the many open rivers pushing fresh water into the ocean, and the Dorado have also become more scarce. On the upside, though, Yellowfin Tuna seem to be topping catch lists, and some very good fish have been caught. Our bottom fish anglers report excellent showing of Geelbek on some of the deeper marks, but these seem a bit wary to bite at the moment. Hopefully, with some calmer conditions during this week, things might improve."



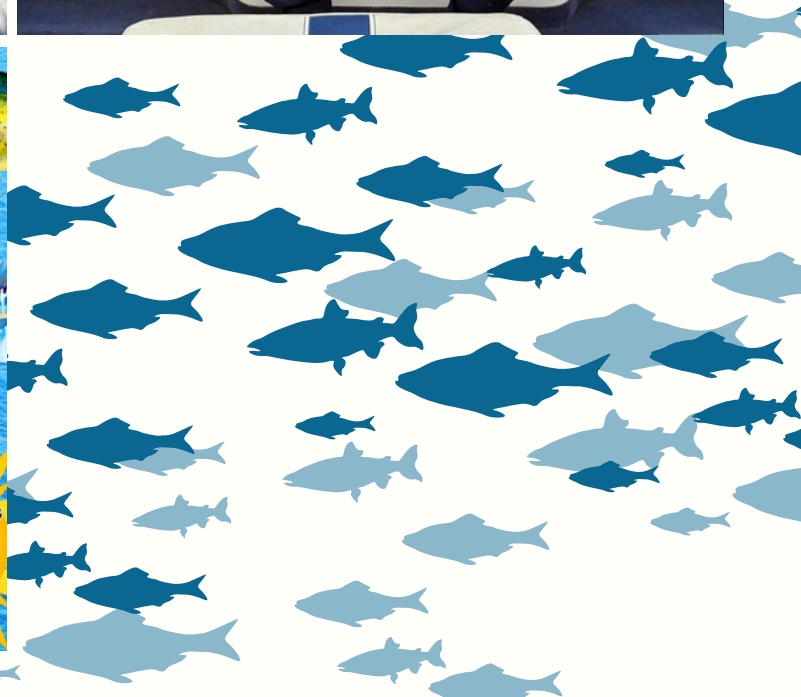

EDUCATION CORNER

Ocean conditions along the Durban coastline can shift quickly due to wind direction, currents and swell patterns. Northeasterly winds often push warmer surface water toward the shore but can also create choppy seas and bring in bluebottles. When winds drop and currents settle, the ocean can transform overnight into calm, clear conditions with excellent visibility. These rapid changes are part of what makes our coastline so dynamic and why patience often rewards ocean users with incredible days in the water.
