EDUCATION CORNER | WHY CLEAN UPS MATTER MORE THAN YOU THINK

Beach and reef clean ups do far more than just remove visible litter. Many of the items collected, especially plastics, break down into smaller pieces over time and can be mistaken for food by marine life. By removing debris early, we help prevent it from entering the food chain and protect everything from small reef fish to larger predators. Every piece removed makes a difference, which is why community-driven efforts like the monthly clean up with **Breathe Conservation** play such an important role in ocean conservation.

Our Durban teams gave their best in a competition where fish weren't easy to find, and our junior anglers really outdid themselves, showing that the future of competitive angling for our club is in good hands. The event also showcased just what a world-class venue we have, with seamless tractor operations and brilliant food. Well done to Mark and his team, as well as our brilliant tractor team and bar and kitchen staff.

Special thanks must also go to **Rob Basher Downs** and **CMH** for supplying the vehicles to ferry the fuel for the competition boats over the weekend, as well as **Bill Harrison** and **Natal Caravan and Marine**, and **Paul Shepard** and **SMG** for finding us back-up boats when we needed them and for the repairs they assisted with. These guys are all superstars for their continued support of the club and its events. We also thank our members for their patience and understanding over the weekend regarding launching and beaching.

The competition also highlighted that we still have some excellent fishing on offer off of Durban. Out of 25 teams, 20 teams weighed fish on the 1st day, and 18 teams weighed fish on Sunday. There were some really good Yellowfin Tuna, Bonnies, Skipjack, Couta, and Wahoo brought to the scales, as well as a few Sailfish, which were videoed in the water and safely released.

We have one more exciting competition left before the Durban Festival, which is coming up this weekend. The **CMH Pelagic Species Social Competition**, which is open to all ski boat anglers has R20,000 in cash prizes up for grabs, with an entry fee of only R200 per angler, and this includes a free boerie roll at weigh-in. Entries can be done on Sunday at the bait store. We hope to see you there.
