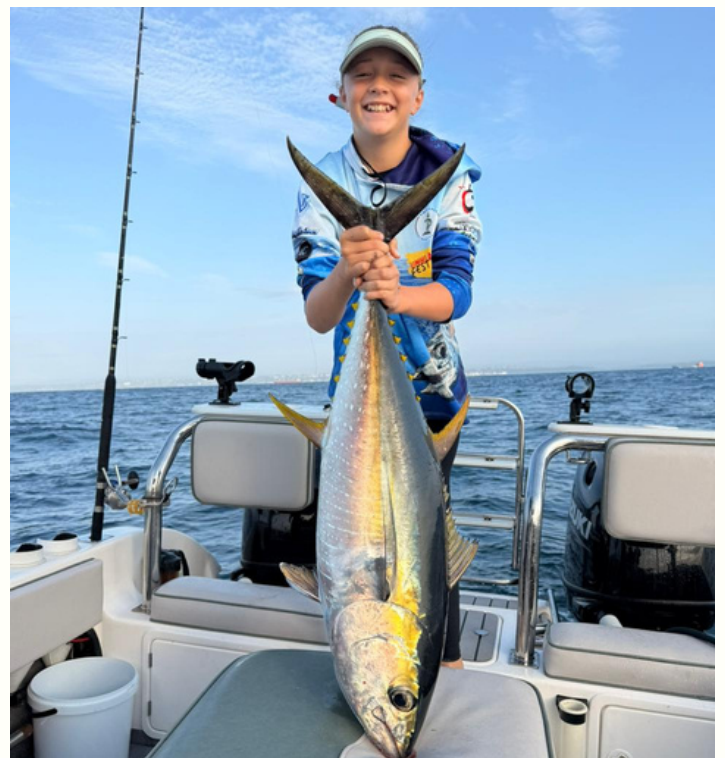
Durban Ski Boat Club



Our young competitive anglers put on a fantastic performance at last week's **SADSAA Junior Gamefish National** held in Sodwana. The Natal U/19s, which included **Claire Joyce**, placed a respectable 5th out of 8 teams, while the Natal U/16s, with Durban's **Declan Hewison** and **Lily Joyce**, took 2nd place in their division. Declan Hewison, who placed 4th in the individual rankings, finished the tournament off with an excellent Sailfish on the last day, and Lily placed 5th, bringing an excellent 17.2kg Yellowfin to the scales to round off her tournament. Well done to all of you.

Meanwhile, not to be outdone by her 2 older sisters, the youngest Joyce girl, **Charlotte**, hooked a very nice Yellowfin of 13.55 kgs in our local waters over the weekend. Along with the tuna, some very nice Coua were also landed, and Natal Snoek and the odd queenfish have made up most of this week's catches. There have also been some promising catches of Geelbek and good Slinger, and Soldiers reported by the guys managing to squeeze a couple of hours in, in the early morning, before the wind picks up.

This week should have some decent fishing weather for us, in the later part of the week, going into the weekend, and this is a great time to be targeting Coua ahead of the **DSBC Festival**, which is less than a month away now. This year's competition is drawing an amazing number of entries and will undoubtedly be another epic competition. If you haven't entered yet, now is the time.

OPEN WATER SWIMMING

EDUCATION CORNER | HUMPBACK WHALE MIGRATION

Every year, Humpback Whale migrate along the South African coastline as they travel from the cold feeding grounds of the Southern Ocean to the warmer waters further north to breed and calve. This migration typically begins around late autumn, and by early winter, their presence becomes more noticeable along the KZN coast. One of the most special aspects for divers is hearing their vocalisations underwater, often long before they are seen. These sounds can travel vast distances through the ocean, offering a unique and humbling connection to these incredible animals.
