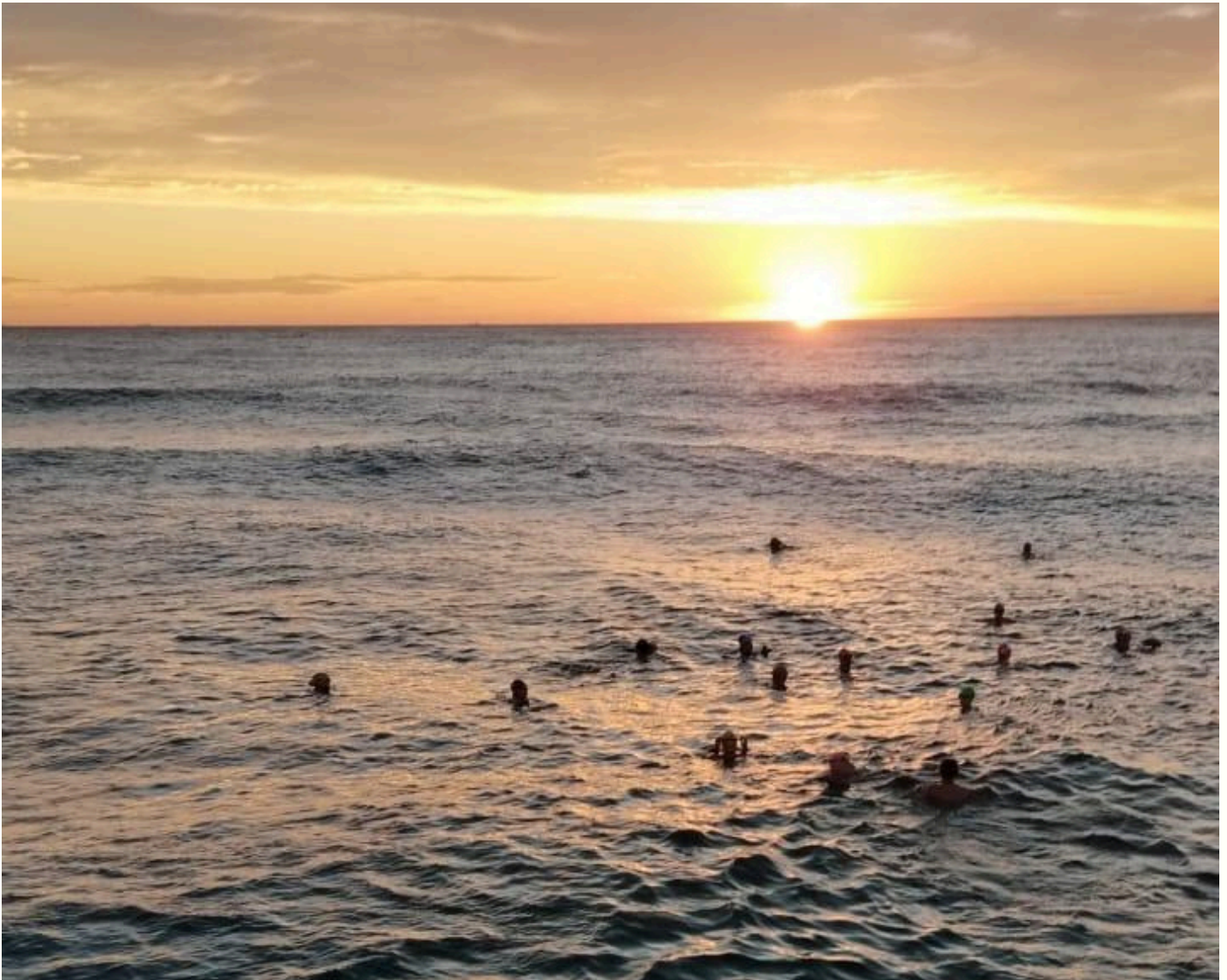

EDUCATION CORNER | WHY WHALES MIGRATE PAST DURBAN

Each year, thousands of Humpback Whales migrate along the east coast of South Africa as part of one of the longest mammal migrations on Earth. These whales travel from the cold feeding grounds of Antarctica to the warmer waters of Mozambique and Madagascar to breed and give birth. Along the way, they pass our coastline between roughly June and November. One of the most incredible parts of this migration is their song. Complex, evolving vocalisations that can travel vast distances underwater. For ocean users, this time of year brings the unique chance to hear these sounds beneath the surface, a powerful reminder of the scale and mystery of life in our oceans.
