DIVING

Join us on the **18th of June** for an important awareness evening: poaching affects wildlife from our oceans to our bushveld. The Dolphin Coast Anti-Poaching Forum (DCAPF) and Snare Aware will be hosting an informative session on how poaching impacts our environment and what practical steps we can take to help protect wildlife. The talk starts at 18h00 in the DUC function room.

Diving conditions have not been favourable recently, so there is not much to report from either scuba or freediving. DUC member **Adrian Pearton** went for a shore entry dive along the North Harbour Breakwater, where he recorded what appears to be another notable South African sighting on the harbour wall. "Thought this looked different to the regular evileye blaasop," he noted. The species has been identified as *Chelonodontops patoca*, highlighting just how much unexpected marine life continues to appear in our local waters.

When the final results were announced at prize-giving on Sunday evening, the Senior team had been bumped out of top spot and into 2nd place by a very strong performance by our Durban Yellow Team. The team, captained by **Alan Gouvea**, with **Ava Burnand** and **Lily Joyce**, was helped to victory by a fantastic 12.9kg Yellowfin Tuna from Lily, which also earned her the award for Top Lady Angler.

There were strong performances from all our junior anglers, including **Declan Hewison**, **JC Lubbe**, **Charlotte Joyce**, **Kaity Jordaen** (who took 3rd place in the individual standings), **Amelia Verster**, and **Nathan Gauche**.

Our Durban Jnr White Team secured 3rd spot, and our Durban Jnr Pink Team placed a respectable 6th out of 13 teams. Well done to all of our talented anglers.

This coming weekend, the focus moves to the **Bobbies Croc Couta Competition**, a social competition in which many of our anglers regularly compete, and one in which they usually do very well in. This year the competition has over R100 000 in prizes up for grabs, and we hope to see our Durban members walk away with the lion's share of that.

There have been some very decent Couta in our local waters, and with Friday and Saturday looking like the best fishing days of the week, these would be a great target species. Good catches of bottom fish are becoming more and more common, so if the wind gives us an opportunity, having a go for some Geelbek, Kob or a Cracker is also an option.
