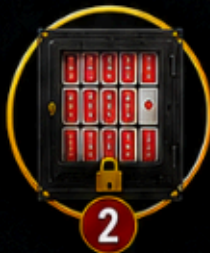

By now, news of the first nets of the annual sardine run on the South Coast has reached pretty much everyone. But even before the first net was pulled at Port Edward over the weekend, there were quite a few reports of giant shoals of sardines at spots like Shelly Beach and even behind the Bluff and closer to Amanzimtoti. As expected, the arrival of these silver bullets has meant a significant decrease in catches of gamefish species such as Couta and Tuna. While this does mean that targeting these fish in their usual grounds becomes more difficult, there is still the option of targeting them on spinning gear around the sardine shoals, although you have to be prepared to lose a few more fish to sharks than usual.

The focus now will be shifting to bottom fishing, and there are a lot of good-sized red fish around at the moment, with some very nice Rockcod in the mix too. Geelbek and Daga are also around in decent numbers, but these seem to come on the bite in the late afternoon and the evenings. A few guys targeting Snoek have had the pleasant surprise of hooking the first of this season's Garrick in the shallows, on the North Coast, and while there are only a few of these clean-fighting gamefish around at the moment, their numbers should increase quickly over the next few weeks.

The Navy and DAFF have been very active off of Durban in the last week or so, and this is part of a bigger operation all along the KZN coast, so please ensure that you have all the necessary boat and safety documentation and safety equipment with you on the water, as their inspections are very thorough.

EDUCATION CORNER | WHY DO WINTER DIVING CONDITIONS OFTEN IMPROVE?

Many ocean users look forward to winter because it often brings some of the cleanest water of the year. During winter, the prevailing winds tend to be lighter and more stable, while reduced rainfall means less sediment and runoff entering the ocean from rivers and stormwater systems. This allows particles suspended in the water to settle out, resulting in improved visibility. While every season has its surprises, winter is often considered prime time for divers, snorkellers and underwater photographers looking for those crystal-clear ocean days.
