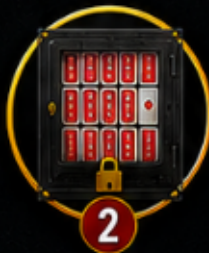

Durban Ski Boat Club



Our Durban Ski Boat Club anglers once again rose to the top at last week's "**Bobbie's Croc Cuda Competition**", dominating in almost every class. **Lily Joyce** won the Juniors-Other Gamefish category with a massive Indian Mirrorfish; **Kaitlyn Jordaan** took the Juniors category with a lovely Couta; **Kerralyn Williams** topped the Ladies section with a 16 kg+ Couta; and our Club Captain, **Mark Justham**, was the overall winner with a brilliant Couta of 20.28 kg. Mark's fish was the only one above the 20kg mark and the biggest in a field of 148 anglers. Well done to all our anglers on this fantastic achievement.

After the initial few nets of sardines pulled 2 weekends ago, the little fish seem to have made themselves pretty scarce. This can be attributed to the very warm sea temperatures off our coast at the moment, with water temps of 23.5° c not uncommon. This has meant that gamefish like Couta have still been coming out in decent numbers around Durban and the North Coast, but you have to be prepared to work for them. Sadly, the sharks have also stuck around and are still taking a good percentage of catches. Yellowfin Tuna, Snoek, and even a few Wahoo have also come out in the last week.

Bottom fishing is still delivering good results with decent catches of Geelbek and the odd Daga being made, although the Geelbek were a little harder to find last week. Good reef species like Rockcod, Musselcracker, and bigger Slinger are also available to those trying for them.

The Natal Deep Sea Angling Association's annual golf day will be held on the **11th of October** at the Amanzimtoti Golf Course, and anyone wanting to enter a team for this event can contact **Alan Gouveira**. The event last year was a huge success, and Durban had a few very strong teams entered. All funds raised will be donated to charity, so get your team together now.

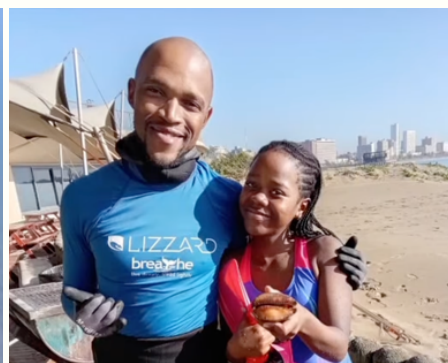
